



This Campership was created in 2021 by the Family and Friends of Brandon Sadowski to provide financial assistance to Scouts so that they can participate in a Boy Scout Council long-term camping program or high adventure program.

Qualifications:

1. Must be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America.
2. Must complete a service project approved by the unit leader for the community, chartered organization or camp.
3. Parents of the Scout should explain the financial need to the Scoutmaster.
4. Scoutmaster certification of applicant's need is required.
5. The Scout must attend camp to receive scholarship.
6. Unit must certify that the scout attended camp via the local Camp Director.
7. The Scout must submit a letter to the Council about their experience and what they learned. This may be published in a council publication.

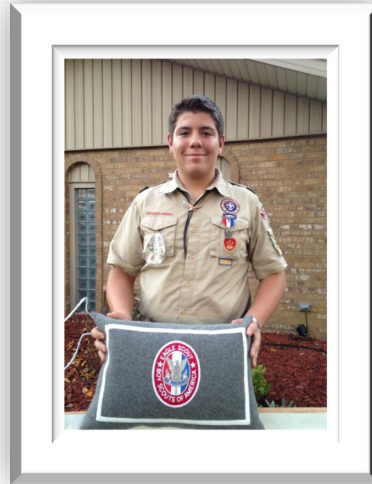

This group of friends advanced through Scouts together and ultimately five of the six would become Eagle Scouts. Unfortunately, the sixth Scout passed away before finishing all the requirements for Eagle. Brandon earned the Rank of Eagle on September 8, 2015 as a member of Troop 63. A few days later, he was awarded the Venture award from Crew 63.

Brandon loved Scouting, spending time in the outdoors, camping and hiking. He attended the Florida Sea Base and Philmont as a Scout. In 2013, he represented the Rainbow Council as a participant at the National Scout Jamboree.
